# Roger Green Medal

The **Roger Green Medal** is awarded by the Royal Aeronautical Society specifically for work of merit which has led to advances or contributions in Human Factors (HF). Recipients are usually nominated by the HFG committee, conference delegates and members-at-large. The aim is to reward individuals and/or teams who have made an exceptional contribution to HF.

### Why an award?

- It is important to identify and recognize those individuals whose skill and effort makes flying safer
- An award of recognition by professional colleagues
- Outstanding active contribution or achievement
- Major innovation
- Exceptional leadership
- Long and valued service
- Work that will further advance HF
- Those who are held in high regard by their colleagues
- International reputation
- Based on merit rather than rank, position or prominence

### How are recipients selected?

- Nominations from Aeronautical Society members as part of the Society awards process
- Proposed by the HFG Committee based on nominations from industry, HFG members and HFG conference delegates

### Who should be nominated?

- Awarded for achievements and contributions in all disciplines of HF
- Anyone who has made an exceptional contribution anywhere in the world
- Academia, engineering, air transport, air traffic control, defence, government or research
- Nominees do not have to be members of the Royal Aeronautical Society
- Nominations of multi-organisations teams are welcome; although preference will be given to teams whose members have worked closely together and where the outcome has been largely dependent on the nominated team member's own contributions.

### What is the award itself?

- Recognition by the HFG Committee and Royal Aeronautical Society
- Engraved, silver medal
- Presented annually at an HFG conference or main Royal Aeronautical Society conference

### Nomination Procedure

- Nominations must be received by the HFG Committee by November 1st each year to be considered for presentation to the Society Awards Committee in the following year.
- Nominations must include the following information:

In the case of a team nomination, please detail the history of the team’s collaboration, including dates, positions held, nature of responsibility and names of key team members being nominated. Continue on a separate sheet if necessary (one A4 sheet only).
